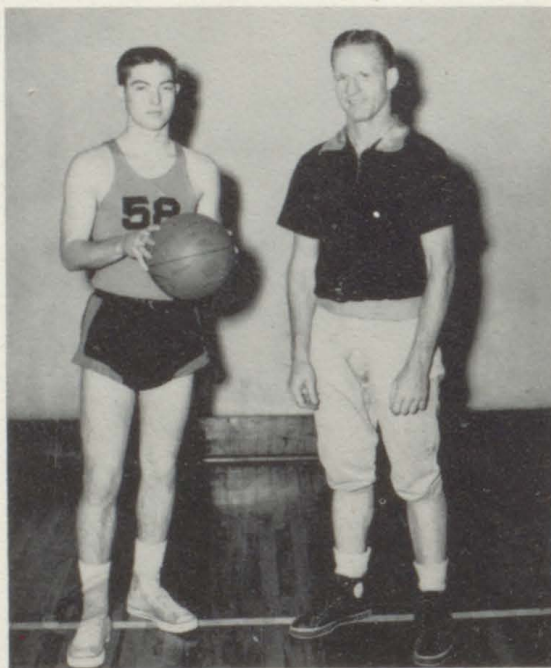
Tiger Rag Award
