FAYETTE 14—HUBBERTVILLE 20

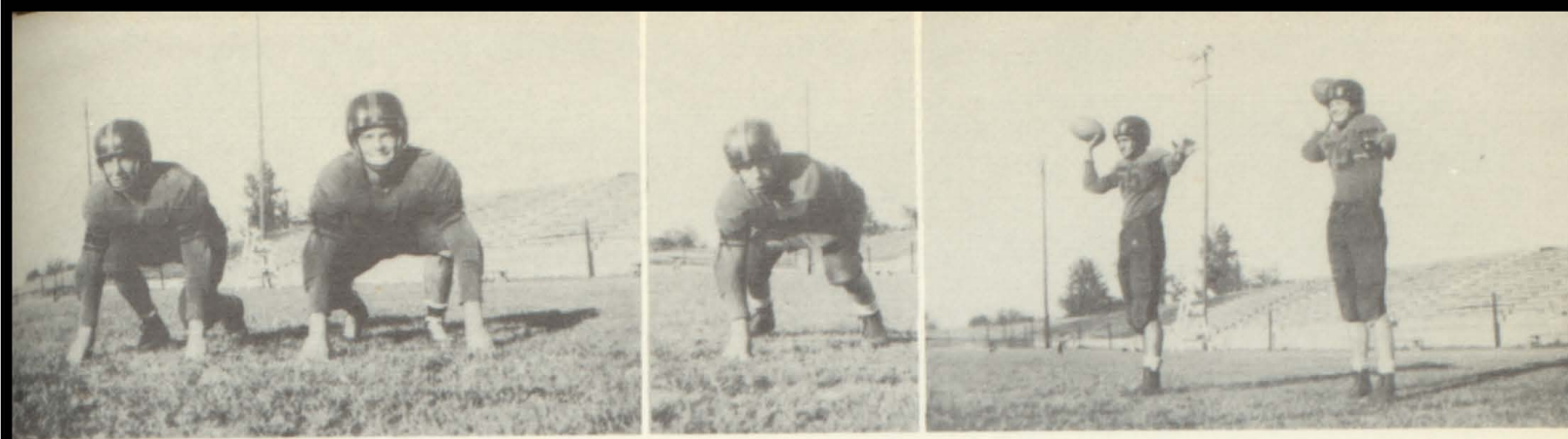

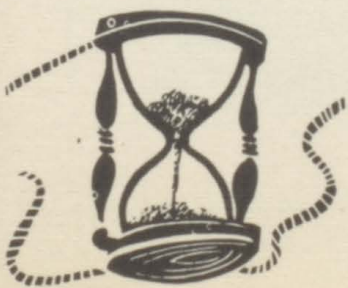
Our classmates were very active in sports and clubs during our Junior year.
